## Awards

- **Dr. Marwan Abouljoud**, **director** of Henry Ford Hospital's Transplant Institute, received the **Excellence in Medical Service and Advocacy Award** from the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee -- Michigan for his work in raising awareness about organ transplantation and organ donation.
